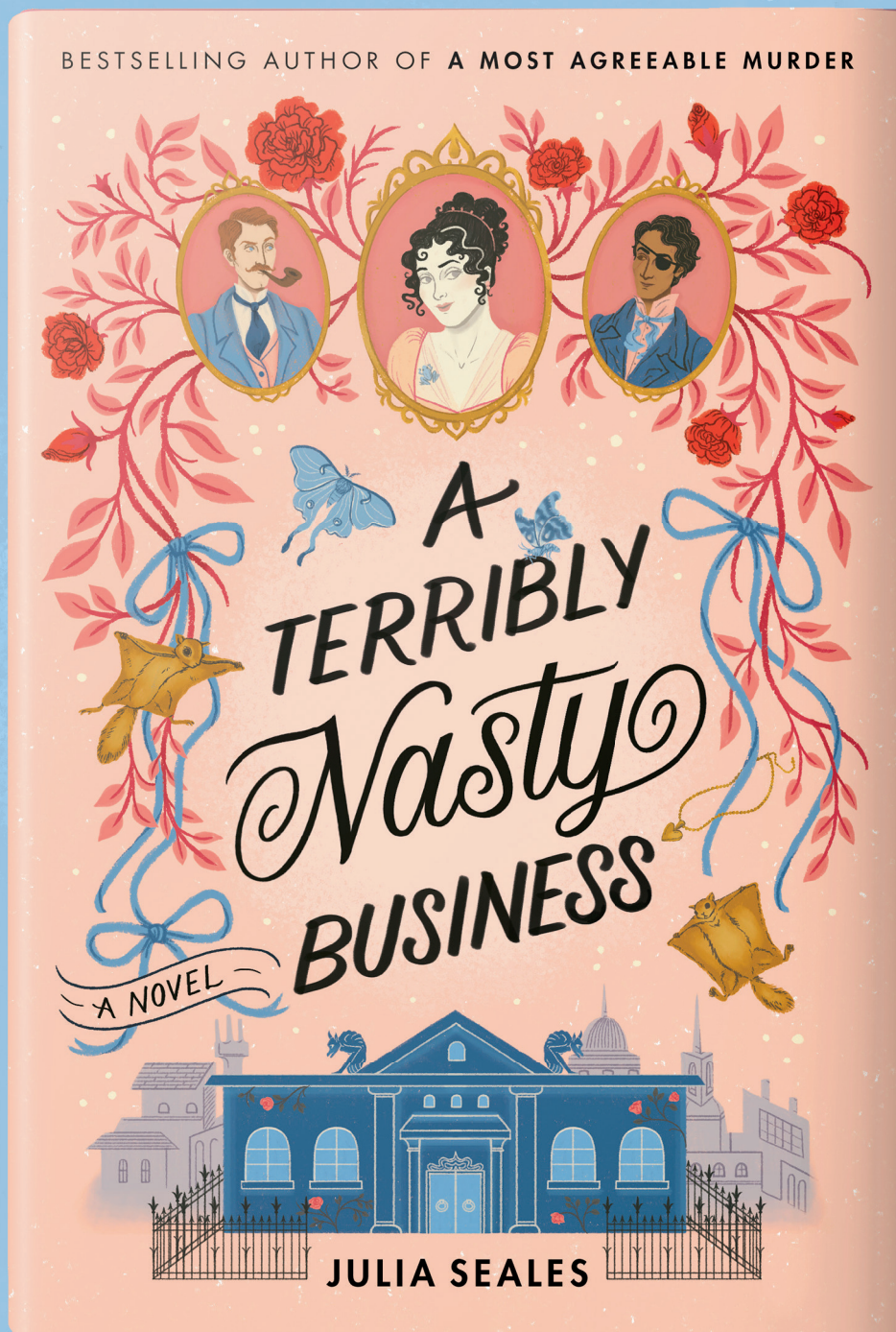

Miss Bolton's Whiskey Tea

INGREDIENTS:

1 Constant Comment tea bag
1-2 tsp. sugar
1 lemon wedge
2 oz. bourbon whiskey

DIRECTIONS:

Add 1-2 tsp. sugar and a Constant Comment tea bag into your teacup. Pour hot water into the teacup and stir until the sugar has dissolved. Next, reach into your hat's secret compartment and withdraw your secret stash of bourbon whiskey. Add 2 oz. to your teacup. Finish off with a squeeze of lemon, and you will be ready to face any and all chaperone duties!



Sweetbriar Punch

INGREDIENTS:

½ oz. fresh orange juice
2 oz. gin
1 oz. Earl Grey simple syrup
Chilled Champagne, Cava, or Prosecco

DIRECTIONS:

For the simple syrup:
Mix equal parts sugar and hot water
with one Earl Grey tea bag. Chill.

For the punch:
In a cocktail shaker with ice, place gin,
orange juice, and Earl Grey simple
syrup. Shake until chilled, then strain into
your coupe glass. Top with champagne.
Take care to sip slowly, else the strong
beverage may expose too sharp a wit.
